ABOUT THE MUSIC

Welcome to *Music That Resonates*. This evening's concert celebrates the ways music connects us—how melody, rhythm, and harmony can stir emotion, evoke memory, and strengthen community.

On this Veterans Day, we open with The Star-Spangled Banner, performed by the Normal West Wind Ensemble Saxophone Choir, as we honor those who have served and reflect on the shared values that unite us.

Tonight's performance brings together students from Kingsley and Parkside Junior High Schools with the musicians of the Normal West Wind Ensemble. Each group contributes its own voice to a program designed to move, inspire, and—above all—resonate.

SPIRIT OF LIBERTY BY WILLIAM OWENS

Written as a tribute to the ideals of courage, pride, and unity, Spirit of Liberty opens with bold fanfares and vibrant rhythmic energy. Owens balances bright brass and crisp percussion writing with lyrical melodies that suggest reflection and gratitude—fitting for a Veterans Day performance. The piece captures both the strength of a nation and the youthful enthusiasm of those who will carry that spirit forward.

BLESSING WIND BY YUKIKO NISHIMURA

In *Blessing Wind*, Nishimura's distinctive lyricism shines through. The piece unfolds gently, with flowing lines and delicate harmonies that evoke the feeling of a warm breeze bringing comfort and renewal. Its serene character invites the listener to breathe, listen, and appreciate the beauty in stillness—a lovely contrast to the program's more energetic works.

DARKLANDS MARCH BY RANDALL STANDRIDGE

Darklands March offers a fresh twist on the traditional march form. With driving rhythms, minor tonalities, and dramatic contrasts, Standridge crafts a cinematic journey through an imaginary world both menacing and heroic. Beneath its intensity lies a sense of playfulness, making it a student and audience favorite. The piece showcases the ensemble's precision, control, and flair for musical storytelling.

DANCING LIGHTS BY RANDALL STANDRIDGE

Inspired by the natural wonder of the aurora borealis, *Dancing Lights* captures the mystery and brilliance of shifting colors in the night sky. Standridge's use of shimmering textures and flowing motion creates a vivid soundscape that mirrors the movement of the lights themselves.

ABOUT THE MUSIC

A RIVER'S FURY BY JAMES SWEARINGEN

In contrast, A River's Fury paints a dramatic picture of rushing water and nature's untamed power. Swearingen's music surges with energy and drive, depicting both the beauty and the danger of a river in full force. The piece showcases rhythmic precision and dynamic contrast, highlighting the ensemble's demonstration of musicianship.

FANFARE 250 BY NOAH D. TAYLOR

Fanfare 250 bursts with vitality and optimism. On this Veterans Day, its triumphant spirit offers a fitting salute to perseverance, courage, and community service. The composer dedicated this piece to the men and women of the United States Army in recognition of their 250 years of steadfast service.

A SONG FOR LYNDSAY BY ANDREW BOYSEN, JR.

Dedicated to the composer's wife, this tender and heartfelt work reminds us of the deeply personal side of music-making. Through lyrical lines and warm harmonies, Boysen expresses love, loss, and gratitude in a way that resonates universally—proof that music can speak where words fall short.

RIDE BY SAMUEL R. HAZO

Hazo's exhilarating *Ride* brings a sense of momentum and joy to the stage. Written to capture the thrill of motion in a zippy sports car, it challenges the ensemble with shifting meters and driving rhythms, culminating in an electrifying conclusion. The piece embodies the shared excitement of musical collaboration and the rush of collective achievement. The piece's



opening statement is written on the wall outside the band office, along with the composer's autograph—commemorating his visit to Normal West years ago.

MUSIC FROM HOW TO TRAIN YOUR DRAGON BY JOHN POWELL, ARRANGED BY SEAN O'LOUGHLIN

Bringing together all performers for a powerful conclusion, this medley from the blockbuster film *How to Train Your Dragon* celebrates imagination, courage, and connection. In the story, dragons navigate their world through sound—using echolocation to sense and respond to one another. In much the same way, tonight's concert embodies how music "resonates" between performers and audience, linking hearts and minds through shared experience.



ABOUT THE FACULTY

RILEY ODEHNAL | PARKSIDE JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL



Mr. Odehnal hails from Lockport, Illinois, where he was an active member of the Lockport Township High School band program. Mr. Odehnal received his Bachelors of Music Education, Magna Cum Laude, from VanderCook College of Music, where he closely studied with Professor Alexander Kaminsky. During his time in college, he developed a large private lesson studio, served as the President of the National Band

Association (NBA) and Vice President of the National Association for Music Education (NAfME) chapters at VanderCook, and closely worked with and served as Lockport's Masterclass Instructor and Brass and Visual Technician. Mr. Odehnal is excited to join Unit 5 and continue the success of the program.

TYLER HARR | KINGSLEY JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL

Ryan Budzinski is the Director of Bands at Normal West High School. He earned his Bachelor of Music Education degree at Illinois Wesleyan University and his Master of Music Education degree at Illinois State University. He has also studied at the VanderCook College of Music, the Ohio State University, Carleton College, and The Juilliard School.

Mr. Budzinski joined the Unit 5 band faculty in 2006 and has been the building's music department chair since 2015. He has served as an adjudicator for a number of music education organizations. He recently completed a term as the ILMEA District 3 Senior Band Co-Representative, and he has served on the Illinois High School Association's Music Advisory Committee.

Normal West students selected Mr. Budzinski to be the school's Teacher Honor Roll Award winner in the spring of 2008. He is a recipient of the National Band Association Citation of Excellence and the Illinois State Board of Education's *Those Who Excel* Award of Excellence. Last year, the IHSA Music Advisory Committee selected Mr. Budzinski as the state's *Outstanding Music Educator*.

Outside the band room, Mr. B is an FAA-certified remote pilot, and he enjoys drone flight and photography. Most of all, he looks forward to seeing these eighth grade musicians participate in band at NCHS or Normal West next year!

ABOUT BAND IN HIGH SCHOOL

We hope the eighth grade musicians performing tonight will continue making music all the way through high school graduation! Normal West and Normal Community High Schools enjoy a rich history and longstanding tradition of excellence. The schools are home to a total of nine concert band classes, five extracurricular jazz bands, and a host of smaller chamber ensembles. The high schools collaborate to produce the Normal Marching Band, a three-time Class 6A Illinois State Marching Band Champion. The NMB will also receive recognition from the Office of the Governor for being named Grand Champion at the University of Illinois Marching Band Championships for the second year in a row. The band performed in the 2025 London New Year's Day Parade and is the Bands of America 4A lowa Regional Champion. We have lots in store in the years ahead and hope you will consider taking part next year!

Placement in the High School band classes are based on students' skill levels, aiming to provide an exciting, challenging experience for everyone at a level where they achieve success. ABOUT THE WIND ENSEMBLE

The Wind Ensemble is Normal West's most advanced concert band. The group's performance credits include multiple appearances in Carnegie Hall (New York), Orchestra Hall (home of the Chicago Symphony), the Illinois Music Education Conference, and the elite Illinois SuperState Concert Band Festival. The band has also performed in the Sydney Opera House (Australia) and at the United States Capitol and Lincoln Monument (both in Washington, D.C.)

Later this year, they will make their second appearance in the Walt Disney Concert Hall (home of the Los Angeles Philharmonic), and they will also perform in the Disney Parks in Anaheim, California.

Members of the Wind Ensemble are enrolled in just about every course offering at Normal West, including the Education pathway, ADP/STEM program, and other Advanced Placement/Dual Credit offerings. Many are all-district and all-state musicians through the Illinois Music Education Association, and they represent all levels of Wildcat athletics, E-Sports, and other activities. It is possible to participate in the band program and a wide variety of other school offerings.
